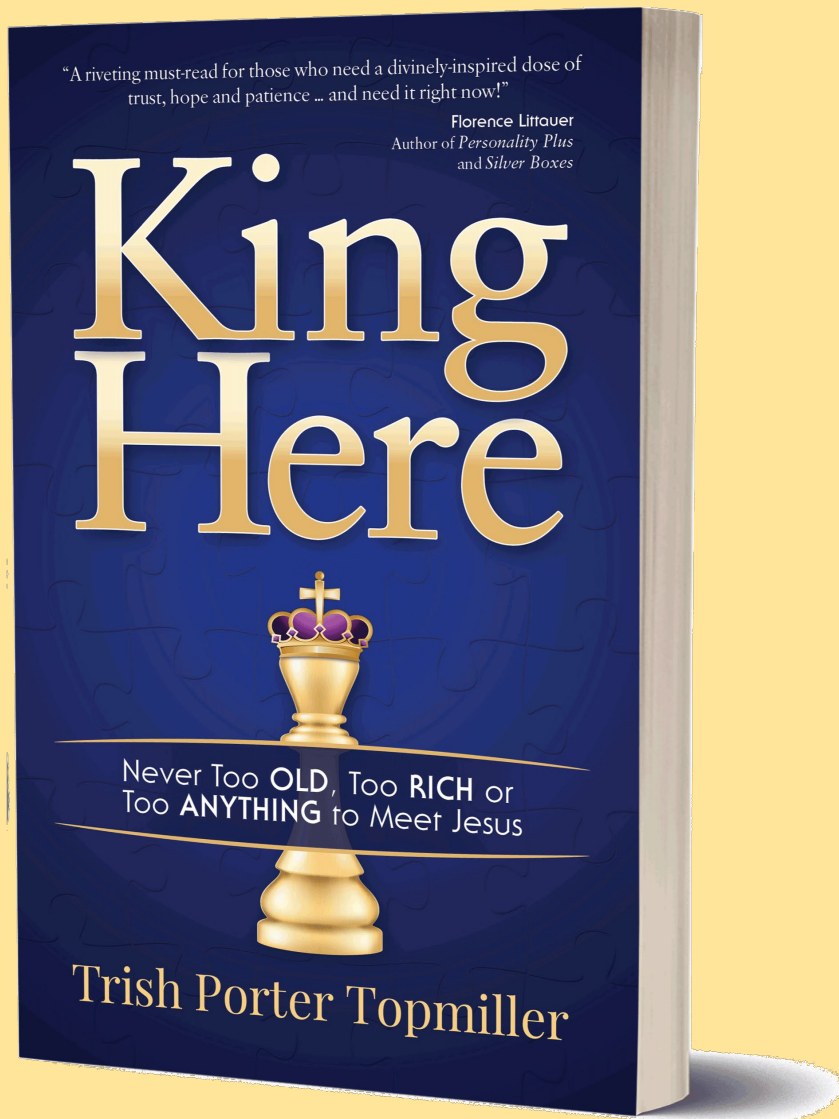

Short Synopsis of *King Here*

1. **“Chuckisms”**: *King Here* is filled with quotes or variations of quotes, called “Chuckisms”. My dad, Chuck King, wrote these in his daily planner over the years and quoted them to all who new him.
2. **Adventures**: My dad loved outrageous adventures and sharing them with others. He went hot air ballooning, competed in the biggest gas balloon race and went around the world in twenty-six days on the Concorde a supersonic jet. He flew a date from San Francisco to Los Angeles in a chartered jet for dinner on the Goodyear Blimp while flying over the city. He rode his Harley Davidson to Sturgis, South Dakota for the 50th Anniversary and sailed his boat under the Golden Gate Bridge.
3. **Athletic**: He was very athletic! A State High School Champion in gymnastics. He water skied, snow mobiled, played tennis, and snow skied.
4. **Success**: He was a multimillionaire entrepreneur who was a real estate developer, venture capitalist, investor and took one company public. He believed his financial fortress was invincible and he had no need for God.
5. **Impossible**: I thought it was impossible for my dad to come to know the Lord because the Bible says “it’s easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than a rich man to enter the kingdom of heaven”. Matthew 19:24
6. **Losses**: Then my dad had a series of losses: almost all of his money, his health to opioid addiction, and my husband Pat Porter (two time Olympian and eight time U.S. National Cross Country Champion) and my fifteen-year-old son Connor (U.S. National Fencing medalist). Then he lost his wife Debe and his purpose in life. Ultimately, he had no hope for living.
7. **People/Angel**: God used many people in my dad’s life. One was an Angel named Michael, sitting in the front row of church raising his hands and worshiping God with his whole body. My dad was inexplicably drawn to Michael. My husband James, who had also lost his wife and understood his pain. My family, especially my brother Charlie, showed Dad the way to Jesus.
8. **Prayer**: Many people prayed for Dad. My Bible study prayed for James to have an opportunity to share Jesus with him. Then at 82 year’s old Dad prayed with James to place his trust in Jesus.
9. **Suicide**: Dad had changed spiritually in many ways but a few months later in a moment of weakness in faith he committed suicide, by an overdose of opioids. We are thankful that “the impossible” happened and he met the King of Kings before he died.
10. **Steps to Share Jesus**: There are seven steps for being intentional and sharing Jesus with others: Pray, be prepared, be watchful, walk through, be loving, be bold, and ask.
11. **The Puzzle**: When looking back at Dad’s life of both success and tragedy, I realized that God was putting all the pieces of the puzzle of Dad’s life together in his good timing.

Why Read *King Here*?

First, it's different. It's a riveting must-read that draws you in with fun and outrageous adventures and sayings called "Chuckisms". *King Here* gives you a glimpse into the life of a multimillionaire entrepreneur who believed his financial fortress was invincible and he had no need for God. It's also relevant to our world. You can't open the newspaper today without reading about the opioid crisis and suicide. My dad's journey encourages you because it offers hope that you are not alone in your struggles. Finally, many of us worry about unsaved family and friends. Sharing Jesus with others can be difficult. *King Here* offers hope and practical ideas in sharing Christ with those you love or know.

9. God sent someone very special into your Dad's life, but he didn't seem like the rest of us. Tell us about that?
10. There was another man brought into your Dad's life and you might call him an angel because you married him. How did God use him in your father's life?
11. Did you see evidence of a changed life in your Dad? Were there skeptics?
12. While we are waiting for our loved ones to come to Jesus, what are some steps we can take to be ready to talk to someone when God calls on us?
13. How is it that a man, who had recently come to the Lord, took his own life? Can he still be saved by God?
14. How do you hope your book *King Here* will help its readers?
15. What do you say to the Christian who feels like they have no purpose in life?
16. What is your book *King Here's* message to us about drug use and it's dangers in our society?

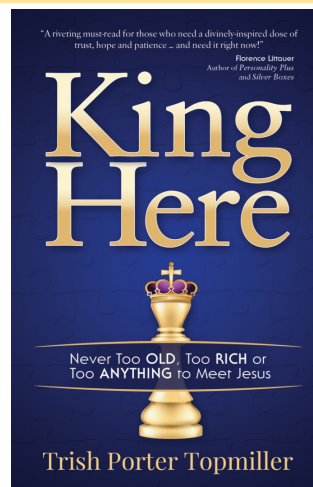
